### Mayor's Pancake Day Challenge Event – Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> February at 11.00am at Ryde Foodbank at Grace's Church on Marlborough Road

For the last 3 years, I have held, in partnership with Ryde Foodbank, a Pancake throwing challenge contest to raise funds for the Foodbank and approximately about £1500 is raised annually. This year the event is around the theme of emotional well-being of Ryde young people and food poverty in families/children. The Mayor will take on challengers along with Cllr Wayne Whittle (reigning champion) to throw as many pancakes as possible in 3 minutes (reduced from current 5 minutes). Challengers have to raise sponsorship of as much money they can achieve. Sponsorship forms will be available from Lind Street offices. Please support me in this appeal as it raises an important issue of poverty in the Town and highlights the fantastic work of the Ryde and IW Foodbank and the work of the local dedicated volunteers.
